

Evidence on the success of the 2 Minute Beach Clean Boards – Planet Aware 15 July 2019



The aim of the boards is to encourage people to do their bit and reduce littering using a visual reminder that also provides the tools for them to act. There are around 500 of the boards in place and a quarter of them are purchased by seaside councils. They are hugely covered in social media – since the launch in 2013 there have been over 60,000 references to #2minutebeachclean on Instagram alone.

Freshwater installed the board in 2017.

“The board at Freshwater has been very well used and hardly any litter remains on the main beach. The Bay around past The Albion Hotel still gets lots of debris washed up because of the tides and stuff. I have put two litter pickers with the board and haven't ever had a problem with them being pinched. I think there was a fault in manufacturing with the first lot I had, so they broke. But nothing to do with vandalism. They have even got a board on Lundy now.”

To minimise loss of litter pickers we will label them clearly with contact details and organisations and that they are part

of the Ryde #2minute beach clean board scheme.

“Thanet District Council is one of several local authorities struggling to deal with litter, especially during the summer.

Every year, the council hires 15 extra staff members and adds 100 bins to their high street to deal with additional tourists.

Councillor Jason Savage, deputy leader of the council, said: “The #2minutebeachclean boards are helping to create a collective sense of responsibility for clean beaches amongst everyone who uses and enjoys the beaches.

“We now see residents and visitors encouraging people to take responsibility for litter, which is a definite shift in behaviour.”

Aside from having a dirty beach with items on it that are a risk to our health and potentially damaging to the local economy, there are lots of very good reasons to remove plastic from the marine environment.

So while a 2 minute beach clean might seem insignificant in the grand scheme of things it is important. They won't break down into micro plastics, strangle seabirds or mammals or end up being ingested.
