SECTION 3 - YOUR PROJECT

Please tell us about your project	In 2017, Isle of Wight Pride staged its first annual LGBTQ+ festival in Ryde with a parade and activities focused around the beach and Eastern Gardens for approximately 5,000 people.
	In 2018, having UK Pride status a larger event was held for approximately 12,000. Both years had been ticketed (free) and organised to comply with the Isle of Wight Act.

In 2019, with the challenge of being in the shadow of the previous year the new Trustees of Isle of Wight Pride overturned the earlier decision to have a 'fallow' year by staging a scaled back event.

This consisted of a parade and community village centered around Ryde Superbowl. Due to the smaller size, it was open to all and was welcomed by many for returning more to the original roots and local community feel.

In 2020 the plan was to return to the beach with an event for up to 4,999 people. This was postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, as was 2021.

This year, as life seeks to find its way back to normality and restrictions on events have been removed, Isle of Wight Pride is working to return with its LGBTQ+ festival in Ryde

We see the July event as the shop window for our work on equality and diversity issues for the LGBTQ+ community, along with local business, groups and the wider Island being part of the celebrations.

Isle of Wight Pride 2022 will take place on Saturday July 16th and consist of the following:

- Parade from Ryde School, via Union Street to Eastern Gardens (depending on road works).
 Departs 11am
- Pride Stage and bar at Eastern Gardens (area between Peter Pan's and the fountain). The stage will be a special trailer unit. It will be positioned along the Harbour wall by the gardens overlooking to an audience on the beach. (This reduces the cost of a stage on the beach that needs considerable underpinning). Time Noon to 19:00
- Pride on the beach Harbour beach. This will be an enclosed ticketed area for up to 4,999. It will be the stage viewing area and have a premium enclosure. We will have fun and games throughout the afternoon as part of the entertainment. Activities will run from noon to 19:00 latest.
- Pride Community Market around Ryde
 Pavilion (rest of Eastern Gardens) we are planning

	on a free area with charity stalls and traders. We hope to have a community stage. Time noon to 18.00 • Work with businesses in Ryde, predominantly Union Street, Lind Street, Cross Street, High Street and on the Esplanade to 'Pride up Ryde' for the weekend by having window displays and offering a welcome to everyone attending the event, along with activities related to their business. We will be encouraging those with their own licenses to stage Pride related events into the evening to keep the party going.

How have you evaluated the demand for your project?	In 2017 approximately 4000 plus attended, in 2018 it was just over 12,000 and in 2019 just under 4,000 to a much smaller event with no staged entertainment.
	Every parade has secured a turn out equivalent to many others that take place in the town.

We know similar events and activities in Ryde are in great demand and bring many benefits to the town. Pride activities have grown throughout the UK, and with the easing of restrictions many will return this summer. They have a large following with people attending from communities in nearby areas, Previous IW Prides have attracted many visitors from the mainland particularly along the south coast. How will you measure the success of your project? Success will be measured by the number of people attending various aspects of the event. Also, the success to local business from extra trade and a surplus of funds to contribute to ensuring the event is sustainable in future years and the Charity can

We will also measure feedback from the community and attendees. In 2018 due to the pathway laid on the sand a young person said it was the first time they had been on a beach. In 2019 the community village received a lot of positive feedback due to the number and variety of stalls.

We see the charity as having a long-term sustainability by being embedded into the community of the Isle of Wight and in particular the town of Ryde. Our aim is to use the annual event to champion the importance of equality and diversity by highlighting the advances that have been made for the LGBTQ+ community in the UK and around the world, whilst also raising awareness of the prejudice and danger that many still face in many countries.

Isle of Wight Pride is open to all to enjoy who share our vision for a world in which people can be their authentic selves with no fear of censure, judgement, inequality of abuse, proving that 'Love Wins'.

Isle of Wight Pride brings with it a party atmosphere which benefits all who take part; including families, visitors and residents in Ryde. There is something for everyone at the event. We have seen how the day has spread benefit to businesses throughout the town and allowed many to affirm their support for the event and its aims.

It has drawn new visitors to Ryde and the Isle of Wight who may not have chosen to come and who we believe will return, not just for Pride but, to further explore our welcoming Island. We know that the event has also allowed many people who left the Isle of Wight in their late

teens and twenties feeling that they did not belong to return home in the confidence that they can be themselves. The power of this should not be underestimated. Isle of Wight Pride has made a change for the better on the Isle of Wight.

There is a clear need for Isle of Wight Pride to continue and build on the fantastic difference that it has made to the Isle of Wight's reputation demonstrating our openness and inclusivity and breaking previous assumptions about local attitudes.

Isle of Wight Pride meets and helps to deliver Ryde Town Council's objectives to support and enhance the health, wellbeing, and economy of Ryde to benefit its residents, local businesses and visitors within a culture that makes the best use of our heritage and the beauty of Ryde.

We do this by bringing value to the Town, value to the community (including having presence of charities and our own information for those who may need help and advice) and showing off the beautiful historic and natural beauty of Ryde. The ability to have activities on the beautiful sandy beaches is a major draw for visitors and a unique selling point for Isle of Wight Pride. In 2022 we will back on the beach. Hovertravel our main sponsor has already allocated a craft for activities the night before and on the day.
